1. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS

The CSI2* as a leg of the Nordic Development Tour, there will be distribution of points according to the World Cup table. The three best overall riders after the final leg, will share €24 000, distributed as follows: 1st place €12 000, 2nd, € 7 000 and 3rd

€5 000. In case of equality of any of the places, the best individual placing will be decisive. If still equal, second best and so on. In case of equality after all four results; the money will be shared.

2. PRIZE - CLASSIFICATION (Art. 126, 127, 128)

Details of system to determine the leading athlete etc. Any other details pertaining to prize distribution.

3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

Please indicate in the schedule the number of athletes to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony of each competition.

After each completed class a prize ceremony will take place. For all the classes, except for the Grand Prix, the competitors up to and including 6th place will be expected to attend the prize giving ceremony on horse.

For Grand Prix competitors all riders placed in the competition will be invited to attend the prize giving ceremony. The owners of the winning horses are invited to attend the prize giving ceremony in these classes as well.

4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

Swedish tax of 15% will be deducted from the prize money.

5. INSURANCES

Details pertaining to insurance of athletes, horses etc. Responsibility of OC for damages, fire, theft etc.

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

RESPONSIBILITY:

Neither the Horse Show nor the OC will be responsible for any accident, injury or damage that may occur to any animal entered at the Show, riders or grooms. The OC will not be responsible for any illness or disease, which may be contracted by a horse, rider or groom.

Owners shall keep both the OC and Horse Show and each of them harmless and indemnified against all liability whatever arising from such accident, injury, damage, illness or decease.

Neither the Horse Show or the OC nor any of its/their officers, servants, agents or volunteers shall in any way be held liable for anything that may happen to riders, grooms, owners, servants, agents, animals or article exhibited or any property brought into the showground.

The OC will not be responsible for any loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatever in connection with, or arising out of attributable to the showground, Horse Show, the OC or any of them or their officers, servants or agents or these or any other rules and regulations or special conditions prescribed by the OC. The OC and the commissioners are not responsible for damage done to property, persons or to fortune caused by accident and maladies or riders, horses or stable staff. Damage done to cars, saddler equipment and other objects (including damage of theft, loss or fire) is not the responsibility of the tournament or the OC and the commissioners.

8. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 132, 1005)

Please list the persons with right of entry to the show grounds (owners, grooms, athletes, and/or other) Competitors and others involved in the show must make themselves conversant with general regulations in addition to the special conditions applicable to the various competitions.

Please note that smoking is prohibited in the stables and in all public indoor areas.

A. STABLES

All horses, entered for the competitions of the show must be stabled in the official stables, immediately following the horses inspection, for the entire duration of the event. There will be two gated stable areas for the international horses, which will be guarded and only people with an access pass are allowed to enter the stables. Smoking inside the stables is strictly prohibited. Offences against this rule will first incur a fine and in case of repeated offence will lead to permanent exclusion from the stables by withdrawal of the accreditation of the person concerned.

Please note: According to rules of FEI all horses in the international stables must be vaccinated for the Equine flu every six months. Beginning April 2010 they are also required to carry a medical logbook. Therefore, all horses, including any young horses the rider wishes to bring for the national part of Equality Line Horse Show must fulfil the FEI requirement if the rider wishes to have them in the same stable. Otherwise, they will be put in a separate stable.

B. IDENTIFICATION

For identification purpose all horses stabled have to carry their identification number whenever leaving the box. Offences against this rule will incur a fine.

C. EMERGENCY CONTACT STABLE CARDS (ECSC)

You will find ECSC on every box door. It is the responsibility of the rider/groom to complete the card in full and affix to their horses stable doors for the duration of their stay at the show. Whilst every reasonable effort will be made to contact the owner/person responsible (PR) of the horse, if unsuccessful the Veterinary on duty will treat the animal as he finds necessary.

D. DOPING CONTROL FOR HUMAN ATHLETES

Doping controls during the event may be carried out by FEI, WADA and our national anti-doping organisation, according to FEI, NOC and NCS's regulations, which we as organisers must submit to, all participants shall be under obligation to submit themselves to doping control. In case of a positive test, the results will be confidentially communicated to the international federation. If a competitor is found to have contravened the FEI Anti doping regulations, the athlete will be disqualified from participation in the event, and the result will be made void. Alcohol-testing may be part of this doping control procedure.

E. ACCREDITATION

There will be free access to the restricted area for competitors, grooms, owners of participating horses and officials. All riders, owners, grooms, officials and organisers must register in the Check-in office to get their accreditation. Two grooms per competitor will receive accreditation. There is a set maximum of two owners per horse providing their name is registered in the horse passport. The OC must be informed together with the final entry if riders want to bring any owners to the show. Private veterinaries have to report to the official FEI Veterinary Delegate, before they will be accredited and allowed to enter the restricted area.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
